




In geography we are concerned with where places are and why they are where they are.





Physical geography studies the physical features and environments of the Earth. For example, volcanoes, earthquakes, climate and rivers.










Human geography is the study of where and how people live, things made by people such as roads and towns For example, settlements, population, industry and jobs.










Environmental Geography is the study of how we affect our surroundings. The impact man has on the environment. The environment may be improved or destroyed.







Burning fossil fuels leads to higher levels of Carbon Dioxide (CO2) in the atmosphere, which causes global temperatures to rise (global warming), which can destroy habitats
