Benito Mussolini - 1883 ~ 1945



In 1919, Mussolini created Fascism

He was the leader of Italy from 1925-1943 and led three political parties. This was the beginning of Fascism;

- The Fascist Revolutionary Party founded in 1915
- The National Fascist Party
- The Republican Fascist Party

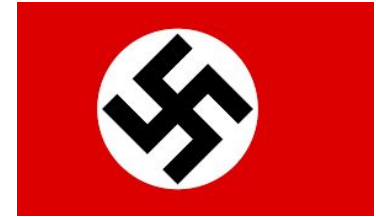


Fascist countries

Mussolini had wanted to bring back the Roman Empire and wanted to conquer foreign lands. However, Italy did not possess a strong military and struggled to conquer Abyssinia (modern day Ethiopia) and Libya.



Symbols

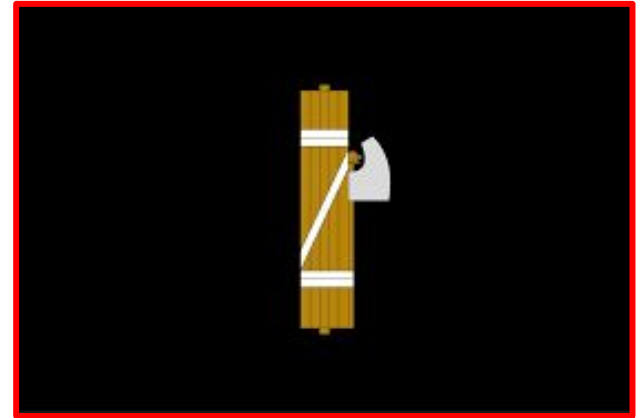
Benito Mussolini **fascis**

Created by Benito Mussolini

Latin word Fasces means '**Bundle**'

Ancient imperial roman symbol of power
carried by *lictors

***lictors are roman servants/bodyguards**



Fasces

The fasces is a bundle of sticks featuring an axe.

This indicates the power over life and death

Discrimination of races

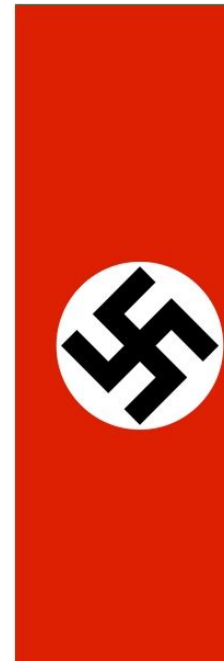
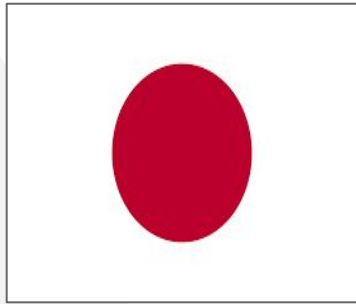
